Students with a B.S. in Integrative Science are prepared for a broad range of careers and graduate programs. Rigorous science and math courses provide a solid foundation and prepare students to think critically and scientifically, while the interdisciplinary and customizable nature of the degree allows students to tailor coursework to specific interests and goals.

A B.S. in Integrative Science enables students to pursue exciting careers across diverse industries and professions. For example, graduates of this degree program have become research scientists, data analysts, technicians, program coordinators, project managers, consultants, laboratory research associates, scientific product representatives, and more. Graduates of this program also pursue healthcare careers including physicians, physician assistants, dentists, optometrists, podiatrists, pharmacists, public health professionals, and more. Additionally, this major prepares students for advanced studies in graduate school, law school, and other professional degree programs.

Opportunities for Graduate Studies

Many graduates of the Integrative Science B.S. program later complete graduate studies (MS and PhD) in the natural sciences. Students also go on to pursue higher degrees in health professions as well as other science sub-disciplines for focused graduate training. Students in the legal studies and public policy option have also pursued law school and other professional master's programs.
